Pricing Guide for RSP.it.com Registry Backend Services

Pricing for Main RSP (Provided by RSP.it.com)

Term of Agreement: 5 years

Setup Fee: N/A

Special Offer: No charges during 365 days (*the ramp-up period*) starting from the date when the TLD becomes fully onboarded (technically ready for operations) in the RSP.it.com system.

Per Transaction (Each Registration Year/Each renewal Year/Transfer)

Fee Eligibility Levels:

- Fee level 1 (5,000* and less transactions per year): \$1 per transaction
- Fee level 2 (5,001* – 19,999 transactions per year): \$0.50 per transaction
- Fee level 3 (20,000** and more transactions per year): \$0.25 per transaction

Fee level gradually decreases from maximum to minimum (i.e. from one to three) instantly once the combined number of transactions in all TLDs managed by a registry operator at RSP.it.com crosses corresponding thresholds.

The fee level achieved by the end of a billing year is automatically extended for the next year and can be additionally improved during that year once the better threshold is crossed.

The fee level to be applicable initially, after *the ramp-up period* ends, is defined by the number of transactions the registry had during *the ramp-up period*.

If as of the end of a billing year the registry is not eligible for a fee level it achieved during a previous year, starting from the next year the fee is adjusted correspondingly to reflect the performance demonstrated during the most recent past year.

***Minimum annual spending per TLD with fewer than 20,000 transactions during a billing year: \$5,000.**

**** Minimum annual spending per TLD with 20,000 or more transactions during a billing year: \$10,000.**

Illustrative Examples of Fee Calculations

Example A

Registry Operator that has 3,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 1 (USD 1 per transaction), however, as $3,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 1$ is USD 3,000, i.e. less than the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 5,000, once the Billing Year ends, the Registry Operator will be invoiced for the difference between USD 5,000 and USD 3,000, i.e. the invoice will be issued for the amount of $\text{USD } 5,000 - \text{USD } 3,000 = \text{USD } 2,000$.

Example B

Registry Operator that has 5,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 1 (USD 1 per transaction), and, as $5,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 1$ is USD 5,000, i.e. equals the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 5,000, once the Billing Year ends, no additional payments will be required.

Example C

Registry Operator that has 7,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 2 (USD 0.50 per transaction), however, as $7,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 0.50$ is USD 3,500, i.e. less than the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 5,000, once the Billing Year ends, the Registry Operator will be invoiced for the difference between USD 5,000 and USD 3,500, i.e. the invoice will be issued for the amount of $\text{USD } 5,000 - \text{USD } 3,500 = \text{USD } 1,500$.

Example D

Registry Operator that has 13,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 2 (USD 0.50 per transaction), and, as $13,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 0.5$ is USD 6,500, which is more than the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 5,000, once the Billing Year ends, no additional payments will be required.

Example E

Registry Operator that has 22,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 3 (USD 0.25 per transaction), however, as $22,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 0.25$ is USD 5,500, i.e. less than the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 10,000, once the Billing Year ends, the Registry Operator will be invoiced for the difference between USD 10,000 and USD 5,500, i.e. the invoice will be issued for the amount of $\text{USD } 10,000 - \text{USD } 5,500 = \text{USD } 4,500$.

Example F

Registry Operator that has 47,000 transactions in a Billing Year is eligible for the Fee Level 3 (USD 0.25 per transaction), and, as $47,000 * (\text{multiplied by}) * 0.25$ is USD 11,750, which is more than the applicable Minimum Spending of USD 10,000, once the Billing Year ends, no additional payments will be required.

Annual Pricing for DNS/DNSSEC RSP (Provided by Netnod)

Services Included: primary and secondary DNS, DNSSEC

Specification: two global anycast clouds, 2 IPv4 and 2 IPv6 addresses sourced from two different ASNs

Number of delegations, per TLD	Fee (SEK), per TLD
19,999 and less	24,000 (flat fee)
20,000 – 59,999	48,000 (flat fee)
60,000 – 249,999	0.80 (per delegation fee)
250,000 – 749,999	0.60 (per delegation fee)
750,000+	0.50 (per delegation fee)

Monthly billing applies, with the first invoice issued upon the TLD delegation into the root.

Illustrative Examples of Fee Calculations

During a month, the total number of delegations under a TLD was 15,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be SEK 24,000/12 = SEK 2,000.

During the next month, the number of delegations increased to 770,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be SEK 48,000/12 + (249,999-59,999)*SEK 0.80/12 + (749,999-249,999)*SEK 0.60/12 + (770,000-749,999)*SEK 0.5 = SEK 42,500.04.

One month after the number of delegations decreased to 55,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be SEK 48,000/12 = SEK 4,000.

Monthly Pricing for Data Escrow (Provided by DENIC)

Number of domains under management in a TLD	Flat fee (EUR), per TLD	Additional charge (EUR) for each domain above the minimum number included in the pricing tier, per TLD
4,999 and less	100	-
5,000 – 49,999	100	0.01100
50,000 – 999,999	600	0.00010
1,000,000 – 9,999,999	1,000	0.00063
10,000,000 – 19,999,999	6,667	0.00062
20,000,000+	13,333	-

For the billing purposes, the number of domains under management in a TLD is taken as of the end of each month; this number is then assigned to a particular pricing tier from the table above, and the total monthly amount to be paid is calculated.

Billing starts once the first escrow deposit is uploaded to DENIC. If this happens not at the beginning of the month, then the monthly fee is reduced proportionally.

Illustrative Examples of Fee Calculations

The first escrow deposit is submitted to DENIC on the 15th day of the month. As of the last day of that month, the number of domains under management in a TLD is 7,000. Then, the fee to be paid will be calculated as follows:
 $(100 + (7,000 - 5,000) * 0.011) / 30 \text{ days} * 15 \text{ days} = \text{EUR } 61.$

Starting from the second month, charges will apply for the full month, as follows:
e.g. if as of the last day of that month the number of domains under management in a TLD is 35,000, then the fee will be $100 + (35,000 - 5,000) * 0.011 = \text{EUR } 430.$

Monthly Pricing for Abuse Management (Provided by iQ Global)

Number of monitored domains, per TLD	Fee (USD), per TLD
5,000 and less	175
5,001 – 25,000 domains	240
25,001 – 50,000 domains	430
50,001 – 100,000 domains	560
100,001 – 250,000	640
250,001 – 500,000	750
500,001 – 750,000	890
750,001+	990

Additional Abuse Feeds (Optional, Separate Charges Apply):

- Spamhaus (USD 0.0003 per domain name per month)
- SURBL (USD 0.0003 per domain per month)
- Malware Patrol (USD 0.000045 per domain per month)

For the billing purposes, the number of monitored domains in a TLD is taken as of the end of each month; this number is then assigned to a particular pricing tier from the table above, and the total monthly amount to be paid is calculated.

For existing TLDs, the billing starts once the TLD is integrated into the iQ Global system – if it happens before or on the 15th day of the month, then the first invoice is issued for this full month; if it happens after the 15th day of the month, then this month is not billed and the billing starts from the next month.

For new TLDs, subject to the agreement with iQ Global, the billing may be postponed until the registration launch date for these TLDs.

Illustrative Examples of Fee Calculations

During a month, the total number of monitored domains in a TLD is 15,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be USD 240.

During the next month, the number of monitored domains in a TLD increases to 55,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be USD 560.

One month after the number of monitored domains in a TLD decreases to 40,000. Then, the invoice amount for this month will be USD 430.
